As part of our upcoming work on the prehistory of Britain, we are planning to take children from Friesian class to Greystones Farm Nature Reserve, near Bourton-on-the-Water. The ancient meadows and rivers of Greystones Farm are home to a diverse range of wildlife and is also the site of the Salmonsbury Camp, an important meeting place during Neolithic and Iron Age periods. We will have the opportunity to walk around the site, learning about the importance of its physical features for early settlers, and will visit the replica round house, before taking part in activities relating to Iron Age Britain. It is a fabulous trip that we have greatly enjoyed in previous years.
